Today's worship:

Today, we begin Year A on the three year lectionary cycle. The main thinking behind the lectionary is to enable the entire New Testament to be read over a three year cycle, with a particular emphasis on each of the Gospels. In Year A, the focus is on Matthew. Matthew is named for the tax collector and apostle. The gospel is directed towards a Jewish based community, many of whom would have been displaced after the Siege of Jerusalem (70 CE). Like the Gospel of Luke, Matthew relies heavily on the Gospel of Mark as the main source. The writer assumes a fair degree of understanding of the Hebrew scriptures, where as Luke, writing to a Gentile audience, sets out to explain some of the customs.

In the midweek lectionary, we being Year 2. This is a two year cycle, and also works on the understanding of reading the entire Bible over the period. The entire book of Psalms is read over a 3 month repeated cycle.




It is right to give our thanks and praise.



God's Love in Action: from the Act for Peace Christmas Bowl Appeal

The prophet Isaiah told people who had lost their homeland and who had been through enormous suffering that they could live in peace again. His message resonates this Christmas Bowl, as we support Sri Lankan refugees to return home and build peaceful new lives after years of bloody civil war.

After years of living in a refugee camp, Vijayakanth and his family returned to Sri Lanka with few belongings. They had to live in an unsafe area, in a run-down rental home that flooded in the rainy season.

But thanks to your compassion, they were supported through their difficulties by Act for Peace's partners, like OfERR (Organisation for Eelam Refugees Rehabilitation).

OfERR is helping returnees like Vijayakanth's family to find new livelihoods and start their lives over in a country that has been shattered by war.

"I am so thankful to OfERR. They have ensured my family's safety and security, particularly my children's. This has paved a new dawn for our children."

Archbishop Philip to stand down as Australia's Primate in March, 2020 he Anglican Primate of Australia, Melbourne Archbishop Philip Freier, has announced that he will step down on March 31, 2020, before his term was due to expire, and will not seek re-election.

Archbishop Freier, who has served a six-year term as head of the Anglican Church in Australia, will continue as the Archbishop of Melbourne, a role he has held since 2006.

Archbishop Freier wrote to all Australian Anglican bishops to say he would not accept a further term, and that he would conclude on March 31 to allow his successor to prepare for the next national synod (parliament). This will take place in Maroochydore, Queensland, from May 31 to June 5 next year.
