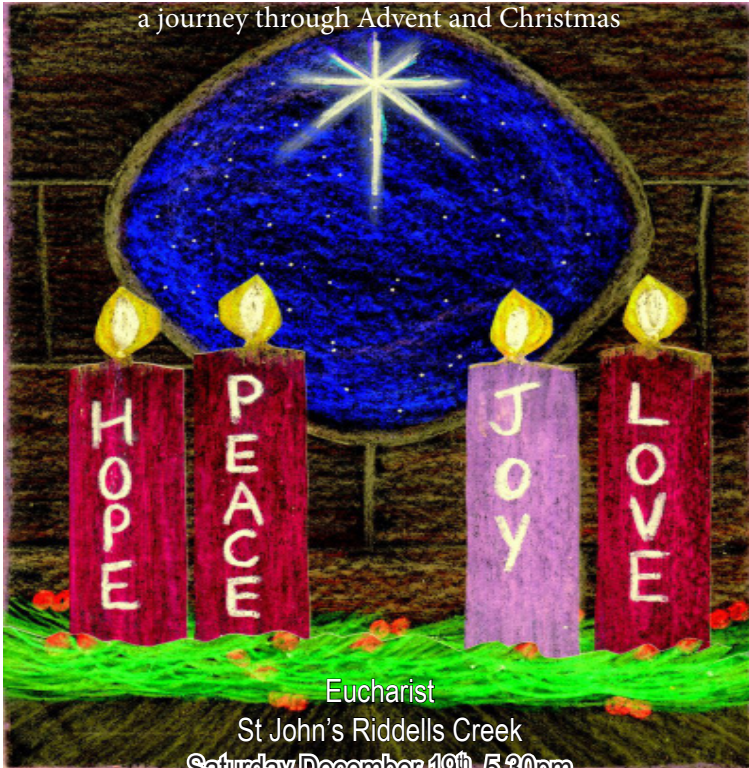

It is hard to believe that we're about to go into Christmas week. As the year has been a considerable challenge, especially with respect to isolation and lack of travelling, the prospect of being together with family is certainly something that many are looking forward to experiencing. There is also for some, the reality that the isolation from before December 6th will continue. Each of us face manifold differences in our journey. For some, this will be the first Christmas without loved ones being around. It may well bring a sense of loneliness and sadness. No matter how we look at it, Christmas 2020 will be very different.

There was another sense of a long journey that we need to keep in mind. Mary, betrothed to Joseph journeyed, as the Gospel of Luke tells us, to Bethlehem. She was very pregnant. The stable being an only option, she gave birth to a son. Over the next 40 days, the Church will be remembering the emerging story of Jesus and his beginning of ministry. There will be all sorts of wonder and drama along the way.

It is in the birth of that boy that our 'hopes and fears of all the years is born in thee today.'

This Jesus of Nazareth was born so that we can be one with God.

This is the same Jesus that promises that turning to him in faith, hope and love we will find rest for our souls. This is the same Jesus, God-incarnate, who risked all and fully embraced our humanity, even to the point of death.

Even so, his birth was a simple affair.

As we move into Christmas in this rather strange year, may our own journey be one of simplicity as well. May we enjoy the remembrance of the birth of Jesus, and simply enjoy being together.

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Parish Fire Policy.

From Parish Council 13 December, 2020

Mrs Alison Kitching resigned her position of Vicar's Warden and was duly elected the Hon Parish Treasurer.

Mr John Lee Tet accepted the Vicar's nomination to be Vicar's Warden.

Currently, there are two vacancies on Parish Council: Hon Secretary, and one Vicar's appointment.

The meeting expressed to Mr Graham Dickinson our thanks and gratitude for being the Hon Treasurer in what could have been the worst year ever for that role. We are so indebted to Graham's hard work, and Mrs Lyndsey Hamilton's dedication to getting the books done.

Motions of thanks were also passed for Lyndsey's work and Janine Sanders (Gisborne Op Shop).

The following motions were resolved unanimously:

- a. that this Parish Council, whilst saddened at the death of Wendy Ann Lindsay, records our appreciation, admiration and love for her;
 - b. and expresses to James, Scott, Andrew and Sam, and their families, our on-going prayerful and practical support.
 - c. May Wendy rest in peace, and with all the faithful, rise in glory. Amen.
2. Motion of thanks to non-returning members: Tony Woodgate (sabbatical); Janice Murphy (sabbatical), Margarita Caddick, Graham Dickinson.
3. The Parish Council expresses its appreciation to Janice Murphy for her contribution to Parish Council and in particular for her generous volunteer care of the garden and grounds at St John's Riddells Creek.

It also goes without saying, but I will: our thanks to all our volunteers for the wonderful work undertaken in what has been a very trying time. As St Laurence of Rome said: Here are the treasures of the Church. Gems all of you!

A motion was moved at the Annual Parish Meeting, and on advice from the Diocese it was an item for the incoming Parish Council.

That the Anglican Parish of Gisborne discuss the possibility of a gradual transition toward cessation of transacting financial business with Westpac Bank, subject to Diocesan consultation, in view of the bank's governance failing to protect the community from serious crime.

Moved: Janine & Keith McDougall

The issues:

- i. *October 2020: Federal Court upheld AUSTRAC, the financial crimes watchdog's legal action against Westpac, fining the bank \$1.3 billion for 23 million breaches of Anti-Money Laundering Laws (AML) and breaches of the Counter-Terrorism Financing Act, including a failure to report 262 customers linked to child exploitation in the Philippines. ('The Age', 22/10)
- ii. *AUSTRAC Barrister, Wendy Harris, QC, ('The Age', 22/10) reported that Westpac had since made significant investments in bolstering its AML compliance by improving its digital systems and retraining staff.
- iii. October 2020: Westpac put aside \$182 million to compensate customers who were sold incorrect loans, overcharged or provided with poor advice. ('The Age', 27/10)
- iv. *Until 2018, Westpac was a banking correspondence partner of the Euro Pacific Bank (facilitating the Puerto Rican bank's dealings with its Australian customers), the latter institution found by 'Operation Atlantis', the largest international money laundering and tax evasion probe's investigation, to be servicing customers previously convicted of financial and organised crime. ('The Age', 19/10)

The response :

- i. Forgive and forget (he/she that is without sin...)?
- ii. Reward for bad behaviour?
- iii. Good stewardship of God's money?
- iv. Scriptural parallel : (Mark 11: 15-19) : Jesus judges the Temple money launderers. Different context but we, the church are a 'house of prayer'. Do we keep doing business with an institution whose failed governance has facilitated money laundering, a practice judged by Jesus?

The Decision:

After discussion and considering the on-going work by AUSTRAC into the banking sector, this matter is to be discussed further in the June meeting of the Parish Council. It was noted that as the Diocesan accounts and ADF are all underpinned by Westpac, any direct intervention at this point may not be prudent. Whilst awaiting the results of the AUSTRAC findings, this will be again discussed at the later date. It was also noted that the only bank not criticised by AUSTRAC was Members Equity (ME) Bank.

The following motion was then passed:

The Parish Council acknowledges and notes the motion presented to the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) by Janine and Keith Mc Dougall in relation to concerns with banking with Westpac. The Parish Council notes the motion and has listed it for further discussion for July 2021, following the full findings of the Banking royal commission and consultation with the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne.

Debra Saffrey-Collins and Mary Duggan were reaffirmed as Child Safety Officers
John Lee Tet was appointed by his fellow wardens to the Incumbency Committee.

Fair Fundraising

Thanks to all those who supported our short-noticed fundraising effort last Saturday at the Kyneton Rotary Market. It was a wonderful opportunity provided by Kyneton Rotary via John Wells for which we are most grateful.

We were blessed with a beautiful morning, provided with a Marquee from Rotary and lots of social interaction as we sold preserves, cakes, plants and Christmas gifts.

We also managed to sell most of the produce donated on the day and the rest was sold at the Church of the Resurrection the following day.

We were alongside Marg Wells and her Craft Stall and very much appreciate her hospitality and friendship as well as her ongoing enthusiastic fundraising efforts for Parish Ministry. Many thanks to Graham Dickinson and Debra Saffrey-Collins who joined me on the set up and early shift and to Chris Clark and Mary Duggan who did the last shift and pack up. We appreciate the efforts of Graeme Millar who collected the EFTPOS machine from the Op Shop and to Fleur Dickinson who so kindly delivered it to Kyneton. Thanks too, to Will Tench and Darren Carr who arrived to support the pack up. We are indeed fortunate to have such willing and supportive parishioners as part of the team.

The funds raised on Saturday/Sunday include considerable presales - \$400 from Marg Wells and my \$185 - a total of \$585, with the overall financial effort being \$1814.10. That should make the treasurer happy!!
