Today's worship: We welcome this weekend our Parish Assistant Deacon Dr Alan Smith! The Old Testament and the Psalm underpin the teaching of the law as Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount. Last week's part of the Sermon reminded us that there is no reduction in our responsibility to uphold the Law of God. Still, there is also an expectation that we will need our take our part in the fulfilling of the Messianic Mission. Out of context, the portion set for today may seem rather harsh, and lacking in compassion. Read as a whole the Sermon shows Jesus' concern that we cannot pick and choose the comfortable 'me' moments all our life.

We live in a community in which there are many challenges. Black and white may well be a popular team choice for some, but the reality for many is that all the shades of the rainbow continue to challenge our cherished positions. Based on this teaching, Jesus challenged continuously not only the Pharisees but also his disciples as to how such difficult sayings are to be interpreted. Jesus opens the way for all followers to explore the nature of the kingdom of God fully and how we live as disciples in our communities.
